SLATE OF CANDIDATES FOR DIETRICH SCHOOL NOMINATING COMMITEE

The following slate of candidates for the 2012-2013 Dietrich School Nominating Committee was prepared by the Dietrich School Council at its September 25, 2012 meeting. The faculty members listed have indicated their willingness to serve on the Nominating Committee for a term of one year if elected. This slate will be presented to the voting faculty for a vote at the November 2, 2012 meeting of the Dietrich School Faculty. Additional candidates, who have indicated their willingness to serve either by statement at the meeting or by prior consent in writing, may be nominated from the floor at the faculty meeting. In the absence of a quorum, the slate will be sent to the faculty by electronic ballot.

Faculty elected to the Nominating Committee typically meet with Dean N. John Cooper and then by themselves to select Dietrich School faculty nominees whose names will be placed on the spring ballot for members of the various councils and committees whose terms begin with academic year 2013-2014. The faculty member with the most votes from each Division also serves as a Dietrich School representative on the Senate Committee for Elections for a two-year term.
