1. Minutes of the Meeting Held on March 21, 2007

Professor Siska noted that the word “forth” was misspelled under items 3 and 4 and Associate Dean Constable noted that the phrase “Associate Dean’s” under item 6 should not contain an apostrophe. Professor Siska then moved to accept the minutes of the meeting held on March 21, 2007 as corrected. That motion was seconded by Professor Jean Ferguson Carr and carried unanimously.

2. Dean’s Report

- **Mark L. Wilson**, Professor of Philosophy, was elected as **2007 Fellow of the American Academy of Arts and Sciences**.
- There have been a number of **promotions to Distinguished Professor** including:
 - **Kenneth Jordan**, Distinguished Professor of Computational Chemistry

- **Lucy Fischer**, Distinguished Professor of English
- **Marcia Landy**, Distinguished Professor of English
- **Robert Brandom**, Distinguished Professor of Philosophy
- **Barbara Weissberger**, Instructor in Studio Arts, was awarded a **2007 Guggenheim Fellowship**.
- **Carmelo Mesa-Lago**, Distinguished Professor Emeritus in Economics and Latin American Studies, received the **International Labour Organization’s first annual ILO Decent Work Research Prize**. Nelson Mandela was also one of the recipients.
- Dean Cooper commented on the public release of the facilities plan that the University has put in place. He described the plan as a long-term framework and backbone for the changes that will occur in the near future. Dean Cooper noted that the University’s previous long-term plan was in its ninth year.

3. Report from A&S Undergraduate Council

Associate Dean Schulte-Ladbeck reported that Arts and Sciences Undergraduate Council met on March 22, March 29, April 5, and April 12, 2007. She noted that Beth Matway, Chair of the College Writing Board, joined the A&S-UC at its final meeting.

Associate Dean Schulte-Ladbeck reported that the A&S-UC approved 37 new courses along with some program revisions to the major and minor in Religious Studies, and a new minor in Korean. She noted that the acceptance of her report and the new minor in Korean by Council would finalize its approval.

A discussion ensued concerning courses that are no longer offered by departments.

Professor Siska put forth a motion to approve the report from the A&S-UC and the new minor in Korean. The motion was seconded and carried unanimously.

Dean Cooper noted that this was the final report from Associate Dean Schulte-Ladbeck and proposed a motion of appreciation for Associate Dean Schulte-Ladbeck's service to the School. The motion was carried unanimously.

4. Report from A&S Graduate Council

Associate Dean Constable reported that the Arts and Sciences Graduate Council met on April 18, 2007. Highlights from that meeting include the completed reviews of TA/TF allocations and training in three departments. Associate Dean Constable explained that the A&S-GC would be surveying departments about departmental professional development activities stemming from an initiative from Vice Provost Patricia Beeson.

Associate Dean Constable noted that the new GRE tests have been cancelled by the Graduate Record Examinations® (GRE®) Board due to major logistical problems. She also noted that the School would be more aggressively recruiting for K. Leroy Irvis Fellowships by offering summer support and multi-year packages. She welcomed any suggestions for improving recruitment for the Fellowship.

Professor Sved put forth a motion to accept the report from A&S-GC. The motion was seconded and carried unanimously.

5. Recruitment Update

Dean Cooper reported that the recruiting season has been successful, with 22 new hires to date out of the 55 total searches for tenure/tenure stream faculty. The incoming faculty are 42 percent women and there were two African-American hires. Dean Cooper noted that there were fewer successful senior-level recruitments this year.

6. University Senate Community Relations Committee Report "Considerations and Recommendations for Community Service and Service-Learning"

Senior Associate Dean Knapp reported that the Provost's Office forwarded the University Senate Com-

munity Relations Committee Report to the School of Arts and Sciences for its consideration. He noted that the Arts and Sciences Bylaws governing promotion mention service in a contradictory fashion and explained that the Senate document acknowledges that the definitions of community service rest within each academic unit.

Senior Associate Dean Knapp explained to Council that there were various options for using the information from the Committee Report including the addition of an interpretive statement in the Bylaws or the inclusion of a section on community service in the tenure workshop offered by Senior Associate Dean Knapp yearly. A discussion ensued concerning the definition and role of service in promotion reviews.

Professor Sved put forth a motion that this A&S Council concurs with the conclusions of the Senate Committee report. Professor Siska seconded that motion and the motion carried unanimously.

7. Nomination of Candidate for Position of Associate Dean for Undergraduate Studies

Dean Cooper introduced as the final item of business, and the reason Council was meeting in June, his nomination of Professor Juan Manfredi, Chair of Mathematics, for the position of Associate Dean for Undergraduate Studies. He recapped the process he followed in identifying Professor Manfredi. This began with a February 6, 2007 memo to Chairs and Program Directors soliciting suggestions for potential nominees. Dean Cooper discussed all suggestions and nominees with Deans and colleagues and called a number of faculty seeking suggestions. He noted that Professor Manfredi has agreed to be nominated, and reminded Council that its role was to accept the Dean's nominee or to ask for another nominee. Once Council has approved a nominee, the Dean would request that the Provost appoint the nominee to the position of Associate Dean.

Dean Cooper provided a brief biography of Professor Manfredi and asked if Council had any questions before meeting with Professor Manfredi. Professor Manfredi was then invited to join Council. Council members were invited to ask Professor Manfredi any questions. Professor Manfredi was asked questions concerning his views on Study Abroad, Academic Integrity, and dealing with undergraduate students. Professor Manfredi addressed these questions, was thanked for his attendance, and was dismissed from the room for Council to vote on his nomination.

Professor Siska put forth the motion to accept the nomination of Professor Juan Manfredi for the position of Associate Dean for Undergraduate Studies. This motion was seconded by Professor Scott and carried unanimously.

8. Other Business

With no other business the meeting was adjourned at 2:30 p.m.

1. Minutes of the Meeting Held on June 1, 2007

Dean Cooper presented the minutes of the meeting held on June 1, 2007. Jean Ferguson Carr put forth a motion to accept the minutes. The motion was seconded by Peter Koehler and accepted unanimously.

2. Dean's Report

3. Election of A&S Council Member as Vice Chairperson to Serve in Dean's Absence

Dean Cooper reminded members that in Section III.7 of the A&S Bylaws, it states that "Council shall elect one of its members each year to be Vice Chairperson, who shall preside at the meetings of A&S Council and of the faculty in the absence of the Dean." Dean Cooper asked for nominations or volunteers for the position of Vice Chairperson. Senior Associate Dean Knapp was nominated for this position by David DeJong. Peter Koehler put forth a motion to re-elect Senior Associate Dean Knapp as Vice Chairperson. That motion was accepted unanimously.

4. Slate for Nominating Committee

Dean Cooper summarized the role of the A&S Nominating Committee, and read the relevant sections from the Arts and Sciences Bylaws (A&S Bylaws, Section III.13). He reminded Council members that a slate of candidates was to be advertised as per the Bylaws, and presented at the fall meeting of the faculty of the School of Arts and Sciences, after which the Nominating Committee of six members (two from each division of Arts and Sciences) shall be elected by ballot. The faculty member with the most votes from each Division also serves as an Arts and Sciences representative on the Senate Committee for Elections for a two-year term. Dean Cooper outlined the duties of the Nominating Committee and the charge to that Committee, so that members of the A&S Council would be able to explain this involvement to nominees from their division. Dean Cooper also pointed out that faculty members who served on the Nominating Committee in the previous year are not eligible to serve this year. He then asked for nominations from A&S Council of suitable candidates for the Nominating Committee, and said that as many departments as possible should be represented on the slate of nominees.

A&S Council members then prepared a rank ordered list of nominees for the Nominating Committee. One A&S Council member from each division agreed to contact these nominees to ascertain their willingness to serve if elected.

5. Report from A&S Undergraduate Council

Associate Dean Manfredi reported that the Arts and Sciences Undergraduate Council has not yet met. Ronald Linden put forth a motion to accept the report from A&S-UC. This motion was seconded by Jean Ferguson Carr and carried unanimously.

6. Report from A&S Graduate Council

Associate Dean Constable reported that the Arts and Sciences Graduate Council has not yet met. Jean Ferguson Carr put forth a motion to accept the report from A&S-GC. This motion was carried unanimously.

7. Bylaws Change

Senior Associate Dean Knapp reminded Council that the School of Arts and Sciences assumed responsibility for the governance of the College of General Studies in August of 2006. As a result of this integration

Senior Associate Dean Knapp proposed a change in the Bylaws that govern Arts and Sciences that would solidify the role of CGS in Arts and Sciences.

Peter Koehler put forth a motion to present the proposed bylaw changes to the full faculty as an item on the agenda for the Fall Full Faculty Meeting. This motion was seconded by Jonathan Scott and carried unanimously.

8. Set Dates and Agenda Items for Full Faculty Meeting

The date of Wednesday, October 17, 2007 (from 1:00 to 2:30 p.m.) was selected by Council. A motion to accept the date and the agenda (as amended) for the Fall Full Faculty Meeting was put forth by David DeJong. This motion was seconded by Peter Koehler and carried unanimously.

9. Appoint A&S Council Member from Social Sciences to A&S-PBC

Dean Cooper outlined the structure of the membership of the A&S Planning and Budgeting Committee and said the elected members serve three-year terms. He pointed out that the three-year appointment of Daniel Berkowitz has ended, and that it is necessary to elect a member of the A&S Council from the Social Sciences division to take his place on the A&S-PBC.

Professor Jonathan Scott indicated his willingness to serve and was declared the Social Sciences representative for the Arts and Sciences Planning and Budgeting Committee.

10. Other Business

With no further business the meeting was adjourned at 2:13 p.m.
